Good Neighbor Scholarship Competition 2011



The Wallace Woods Neighborhood Association believes that the future well-being of Covington and its residents depends on young people who take pride in their neighborhoods, and who give back to the community in a positive way. To encourage these values, we wish to participate in the education of a young person who, through his/her service, demonstrates positive community involvement. This award is based only on good citizenship and community service. Financial status is not a consideration. Grade point average is not a consideration.

To be eligible:

1. **You must be a resident of Covington, KY.**
2. **You may be no older than 24 years of age as of March 31, 2011.**
3. **You must have performed voluntary community service.**
4. **You must be enrolled in or planning to enroll in an accredited two- to four-year post-secondary educational institution for the 2011 – 2012 school year. Vocational and Technical programs are included.**

One winner will be selected from qualified applicants, and the scholarship money will be sent to the accredited educational institution of the winner's choice.

If the scholarship award is not used by March 31, 2012, it will be forfeited.

Completed applications and all required forms must be received by WWNA by Wednesday, March 31, 2011.

Applications from students who do not meet eligibility criteria will be disqualified.

Scholarship winner will be notified by April 30, 2011.
