Dual-Credit Program

Thomas More's Dual-Credit (TMDC) Program offers high school students the opportunity to take college classes with Thomas More faculty or credentialed high school instructors at their high school, online, or at our Crestview Hills campus. Courses are offered at a discounted tuition rate until a student's graduation from high school.

For any student considering dual credit with Thomas More, an application must be completed and submitted. All applications will be reviewed for acceptance by the TMDC office.

ADMISSION TO THE TMDC PROGRAM

For entry into the program:

1. High school sophomores
 - Must have a high school unweighted GPA of 3.0+.
 - Must meet any course prerequisites.
 - Must only take courses offered onsite at their high school (some exceptions may apply).
2. High school juniors and seniors
 - Must have a high school unweighted GPA of 3.0+.
 - Must meet any course prerequisites.

To remain in the program:

- All students must maintain a cumulative Thomas More GPA of 2.0 or higher to remain in the program.

Application process:

- If a student meets the admission criteria, they are eligible to apply for the TMDC program.

To apply, students must complete the following:

- Indicate your interest in dual-credit to your high school counselor.
 - Students and their parent/guardian will need to complete the online application at: thomasmore.edu/dualcredit.
 - If your course requires an ACT/SAT/CLT score, please have that official score report sent to Thomas More.
 - School counselors will submit the students high school transcript.
- Once the online application has been completed and the high school transcript received, the TMDC office will review the application and work with the high school/student to register and complete next steps.

Cost and Fees:

- Students are responsible for the cost of tuition and any course materials.
- Tuition is set by the Commonwealth of Kentucky each year. For the most current rate, please contact us.
- Scholarships may be available, please contact your high school counselor for more information.
