The goal of the Department of Accountancy is to provide students with a broadly oriented education with special attention devoted to the functions, theory and practice of accounting as related to contemporary society. As such, the accountancy curriculum prepares students for positions in public accounting, industry, the government, and the not-for-profit sector. The curriculum meets the course requirements in accountancy and business administration recommended by professional organizations and mandated by many State Boards of Accountancy. In addition, all students majoring in Accounting also receive a minor in Business Administration.

The Accountancy Department has several flexible educational options available for students planning to sit for the Uniform CPA Examination. Students should consult with the department chairperson early in the program to determine the plan of study best suited to their needs. The Department also actively supports the CMA, CIA and other professional certifications. The Accountancy Department encourages all accountancy majors to participate in the Co-op Program to gain valuable practical experience prior to graduation.
