

Dual-Credit Student Outcomes

WHAT ARE THE OUTCOMES THAT A STUDENT WILL HAVE WHILE ENROLLED IN DUAL-CREDIT?

- Earn college credit that can be applied towards a degree at Thomas More or transferred to another institution.
- Receive exposure to college courses in various formats (online/hybrid/in-person) to assess which style of learning best suits each student.
- Personalize a student's learning through exploration of potential majors and career paths with targeted advising or enrolling in a Dual Credit Pathway.
- Build a bridge for an easier transition between high school and college.
- Explore opportunities for advancing knowledge learned in the classroom towards research and project opportunities at the collegiate level.
- Utilize Five Seasons Country Club, the Benedictine Library, tutoring (general, math/physics, and Writing Center during their dual enrollment).
- Add college experience to a student's resume that helps them stand out on college and scholarship applications.
- Engage with high school students from different schools as well as traditional college students.

WHAT ARE THE OUTCOMES THAT A STUDENT WILL TAKE WITH THEM AFTER HIGH SCHOOL?

- Navigate and familiarize with programs and offices that students will utilize as college students (e.g. Office of Student Accessibility, advising, tutoring, etc.).
- Navigate and familiarize with policies and procedures that students will utilize as college students (e.g. Canvas, paying tuition, buying course materials).
- Increase the likelihood that a student is retained each year in college.
- Increase the likelihood of graduation from college after four and six years.
- Learn self-advocacy by communicating with their professors, counselors, and university staff to address issues and concerns in the dual-credit program.
- Improve time management skills by completing college coursework on top of high school coursework, other dual-credit courses at other colleges, extracurricular activities, etc.
- Save time and money towards a college degree to allow for students to add additional majors and minors, study abroad, and/or take an internship when in college.
