Online course options for students (not listed on TMU schedule):

These courses are only open for dual credit students

BUA 105 - INTRODUCTION TO BUSINESS

- This course counts towards the Pre-Business Dual-Credit Pathway
- Prerequisite: None
- Description: An introduction to the structure, functioning, and role of the business and economic systems.

COM 105 - FUNDAMENTALS OF PUBLIC SPEAKING

- This course counts towards the Communication, and Sports and Entertainment Marketing Dual-Credit Pathways
- Core Area: Communication
- Description: An introductory course in the fundamentals of public speaking. Study includes a theoretical approach to the analysis, organization and delivery of various speeches. Other topics will include effective presentation and public and mass media levels. This course fulfills the core requirement in Communication.

CRJ 101 - INTRODUCTION TO CRIMINAL JUSTICE

- This course counts towards the Criminal Justice Dual-Credit Pathway, Law Pathway
- Prerequisite: None
- Description: An introduction to the philosophical and historical background and development of the criminal justice system. Review of criminal justice functions, processes and procedures, and an examination of current trends and concepts are also explored. A grade of C or higher in this course is required for all higher-level Criminal Justice courses.

ELS 115 – INTRODUCTION TO ETHICAL LEADERSHIP

- This course counts towards the Ethical Leadership Dual Credit Pathway
- Prerequisite: None
- Description: This course introduces the core elements that comprise leadership, the internal workings of the organization from a leadership perspective, and in-depth review of the major concepts, elements, and terminology of leadership. Students will engage in discussions and review of current literature leading to leadership and ethical behaviors.

LAW 105 - INTRODUCTION TO LAW

- This course counts towards the Law Dual Credit Pathway
- Core Area: Social Science
- Prerequisite: None

• Description: An introduction to various aspects of the legal profession, such as exploring a legal career, applying to law school, career options, basic legal terminology, and the court system.

MAT 205 - INTRODUCTORY STATISTICS

- General Education/Core Area: Mathematics
- Prerequisite: minimum ACT Math score of 18 or minimum Math SAT score of 550 or minimum score of 70% on KYOTE exam
- Description: An investigation of graphic methods, frequency distributions, percentiles, central tendency, variability, standard scores, normal and binomial distributions, hypothesis testing, and correlation.

MUS 260 – MUSIC IN WORLD CULTURES

- General Education/Core Area: Fine Arts
- Prerequisite: None
- Description: An introduction to the music of non-western countries. Content emphasizes diversity and uniqueness by exploring the music of India, Japan, Sub-Saharan Africa, Native America, Indonesia, Latin America, the Middle East, and others.

PSY 105 - GENERAL PSYCHOLOGY

- This course counts towards the Psychology and Education Dual-Credit Pathways
- General Education/Core Area: Social Science
- Prerequisite: None
- Description: An introduction to the field of Psychology and to the methods of study used by psychologists. Emphasis is placed on a scientific approach to understanding human behavior. Topics covered include the biological basis of behavior, sensation, perception, learning, memory, personality, abnormal behavior, and social behavior. PSY 105 is a prerequisite for all other Psychology courses.

SPA 201 – SPANISH LEVEL II, PART 1 (equivalent to year 3 of Spanish)

- Prerequisite: SPA 101/102 or the equivalent (year 3 of high school Spanish)
- Description: A review of grammar, conversation and reading. Students will expand language skills acquired in SPA 101, 102. Increased attention will be given to understanding culture through authentic activities. Typically, students with three years of high school Spanish are placed in 201.
